

Eager to take on a more proactive role, the Communications Team identified an opportunity to leverage their communication and social media skills by organizing one of the seven bi-weekly FYFs. The session covered various aspects, such as writing professional emails, creating polished email signatures, maintaining an appropriate online presence on social media, and crafting a standout LinkedIn profile. Cohort-Specific Events

Using the feedback we collected at our cohort conversations in the Spring, this semester we launched cohort-specific events to build more progression into Sapphire's leadership curriculum and offer opportunities for each cohort to regroup in their Sophomore, Junior, and Senior years. Cohort-specific events will be a continued modification of the points system. In past years, the Sapphire's points requirements were 20 PD, 20 LD, 20 CS, and 60 general points. While we haven't changed the overall quantity of points, we focused the scope so 10 PD and 10 LD points come from attending cohort-specific events (FYF participation included). Meaningful experiences that meet students where they are in their college careers as well as building cohort connections were a high priority, and we have been receiving energizing feedback from upperclassmen. As the incoming advising team continues to refine the 4-year strategic plan, we are excited to see how this added structure continues to support our members' personal leadership journeys.
